### What are they?



- sets out the outcomes and indicators used to hold NHS Commissioning Board to account for its outcomes delivered through commissioning health services from 2012/13
- sets direction of travel in the journey for improving outcomes
- opportunity for the NHS to understand what an NHS focussed on outcomes means for individuals, organisations and health economies

# The Public Health Outcomes Framework



### 2 overarching outcomes

- Increased healthy life expectancy (including health quality, as well as length of life)
- Reduced differences in life expectancy (through improvements in the most disadvantaged communities)

- Health Improvement

# The Public Health Outcomes Framework



### **Indicators**

- Health Improvement
  - Reducing excess weight in adults
  - Reducing smoking prevalence in adults
  - Earlier diagnosis
  - Cancer screening coverage

  - Population vaccination coverage (HPV)
- Improving public health & reducing premature mortality
  - Reducing cancer mortality

- Reducing mortality & improving survival
  - NAEDI
    - Awareness campaigns
    - Improving access to diagnostics
    - Raising GP awareness
  - Better treatment



- Improving Quality of Life
  - Cancer survivorship
    - Vision document 2011
  - PROMS (Patient reported outcomes measures)
    - 2011 pilot programme in breast, colorectal, prostate & lymphoma



- Enhancing recovery
  - Initially colorectal, gynae, urology
