- Improved access for GPs to diagnostic tests

- Call for a national awareness campaign
- All Party Parliamentary Group on Ovarian Cancer

IMPACT



Aims and objectives include

- To consult more widely with clinicians for the first time
- To re-measure key aspects of the first study (e.g. awareness, access to diagnostics, challenges facing CNS, women)
- Open up new opportunities to improve care for women
- To explore the impact of recent challenges in the health environment on the care for women with ovarian cancer



ADVISORY PANEL 2012





- Tracked changes in knowledge since 2009
- Positive and significant rises
- A long way to go.....

AWARENESS





- Positive shifts in knowledge and attitudes
- Much larger awareness of NICE guidance than DH Messaging
- But one in ten have been refused access to diagnostic tests
- Need for roll out of DH access to diagnostics programme
- More GPs need to refer

GP KNOWLEDGE & ACCESS TO DIAGNOSTICS



- Very strong similarities except in a few areas
- Information meets not met for 25% (diagnosis, chemo, surgery)
- Increased access to CNS but sharp fall in importance of CNS
- Fall in number of women asked about clinical trials
- Women WILL TRAVEL
- Women need most support AFTER TREATMENT


